- 2. All professional development materials (i.e. books, software, course materials, etc.):
  - a. Must be designed to improve instruction for Atageted students (i.e. struggling students, nontraditional learners, lowperforming, etc.) OR must align with the New York State Learning Standards in the corresponding subject area.
  - b. Must be free from religious content.
- 3. All professional development programs (i.e. courses, workshops, seminars, etc.):
  - a. Must explicitly state the course is designed to improve instruction fortakted students (i.e. struggling students, rtoarditional learners, lowperforming, etc.)

    OR must align with the New York State Learning Standards in the corresponding subject area.
  - b. Must be free from religious content.

Note: the costs of eligible iperson professional development opportunities may be shared among multiple schools when presented to groups from each participating school.

Pooling:
